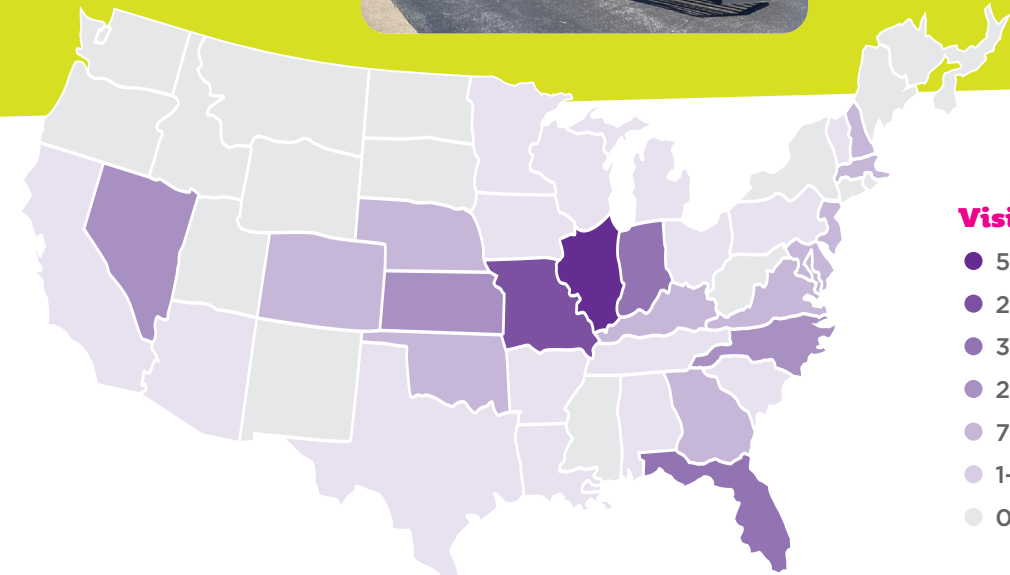


Bringing Families Together with Special Events at ECM

Coming This Spring! Route 66 Roadway



With grants from the Rivers & Routes Tourism Board and the State of Illinois, ECM's Discovery Garden is on track to capture the freedom, adventure, and history of Route 66 and reimagine it for today's young thrill-seekers!

Kids can get their kicks by climbing into mini pedal cars at the H&F Exteriors Garage, fuel up at the Phillips 66 Filling Station, and cruise our mini Mother Road (while keeping an eye out for the stoplights!).

A special roadside attraction - the Water Play Area sponsored by American Water - gives drivers the chance to stop and play at the three-level water table

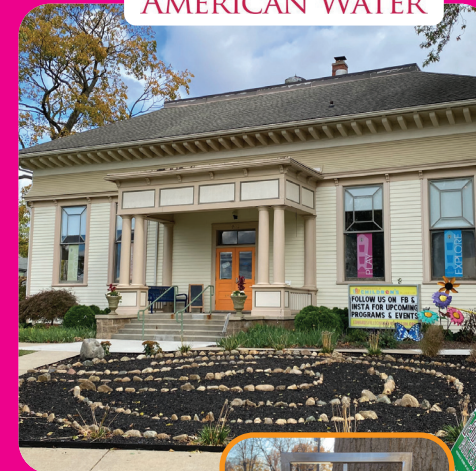
and learn how the Missouri and Mississippi River Confluence shaped travel and trade in the Riverbend area.

Peace Garden

This Spring, visitors can experience the wonder of the Museum before even stepping through our front door!

Our new Peace Garden, located on the front lawn of the Museum, features a labyrinth maze where a friendly minotaur waits amidst the twists and turns, a snake-themed pathway inspired by the exhibits indoors, and a selfie-ready giant butterfly embellished with art created by ECM visitors.

Of special importance is the new Anne Frank memorial. By peering through the metal window sculpture, guests can observe ECM's chestnut tree, the Franks' only connection to nature while in hiding and a symbol of peace and hope in difficult times.

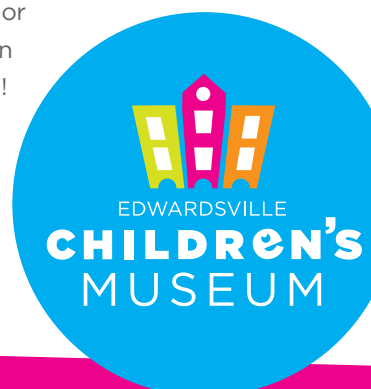
Celebrating 20 Years at the Children's Museum!

Stories of the Nickel Plate

The Edwardsville Children's Museum is thrilled to present the new "Stories of the Nickel Plate" exhibit in the Windland Education Center at Nickel Plate Station.



This interactive exhibit uses visuals and audio to introduce children and their families to four storytellers with a special connection to the station. From Phillip Schaefer, who boarded a train for boot camp during World War I, to Mildred Shaw who taught for more than 20 years at Leclair Kindergarten, "Stories of the Nickel Plate" fuses the stories of the station with defining moments in our region's history.

Children can also create their own train-themed memories by experiencing the exhibit's hands-on activities. By climbing aboard ECM's new eight-foot wooden replica train, they can imagine having a meal in the dining car or play the role of railway post office clerks by using their speed and skills to collect mail bags along their journey. Nickel Plate Station has played a significant role in the development of Edwardsville, and we're proud that it continues to make a positive impact on our community as an education center through ECM.



Family Firefly Nights for the Micro Forest Citizen Science Project

Funded by Phillips 66, the Micro Forest Citizen Science Project let kids get their hands dirty and perform real-world research on the ecological impact of the ECM Micro Forest, our two-acre urban woodlands featuring more than 300 native trees and plants.

We hosted a series of firefly nights where young scientists counted lightning bugs for the Mass Audubon national Firefly Watch database. The goal of this project was to help kids learn how the Micro Forest is enhancing local biodiversity and share their data with scientists from across the country who are tracking the fireflies' geographic movements.

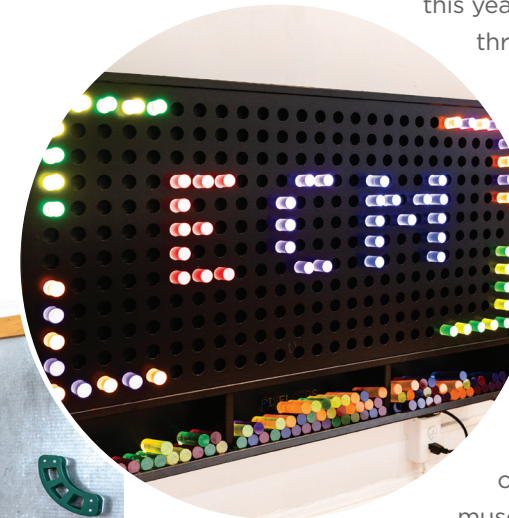


Animal Hospital

Envisioning Green also constructed a kid-sized outdoor kitchen and dining table alongside our garden beds to introduce kids to the "farm-to-table" dining concept, giving them the chance to play chef for the day.

Guests are also encouraged to wander the tactile path that meanders through the Sensory Garden. Along the journey, kids can ignite their five senses, whether touching the fuzzy or prickly leaves, listening to sounds from the wind chimes, or tasting fresh herbs from the garden.
